Know all Men by these Presents that we Elizabeth  
Dixon of the Parish of Lockfield in the County of  
Durham widow and Daniel Turner of the same  
Parish

are held and firmly bound unto the Right Reverend Father  
in GOD, JOHN, by Divine Providence Lord Bishop  
of Durham, and to the Right Worshipful William Wynne,  
Doctor of Laws, his Vicar General, and Official Principal,  
lawfully constituted, in the Sum of Four hundred  
Pounds of good and lawful Money of Great Britain, to be  
paid to the said Reverend Father, his said Official, their  
lawful Attorney, in this behalf, or their Executors, Admi-  
nistrators, or Successors, to which Payment well and truly  
to be made, we do bind ourselves, and each of Us, by her self and  
himself jointly and severally for the whole, our joint and several Heirs,  
Executors, and Administrators, firmly by these Presents.

(116) Sealed with our Seals, dated the Nineteen<sup>th</sup> Day of  
August in the Nineteen<sup>th</sup> year of the Reign  
of our Sovereign Lord George the Third by the Grace of  
God, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, King, De-  
fender of the Faith, and so forth, and in the year of our  
Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy nine

THE Condition of this Obligation is such, That if the  
above-bounden Elizabeth Dixon

do well and truly execute and perform the last Will and Te-  
stament of Jeremiah Dixon late of the Parish of  
Lockfield aforesaid in the Diocese of Durham  
Gentleman her late Brother

deceased, and pay the said deceased's  
Debts and Legacies, as Law requires; if also she do exhibite  
a true and exact Inventory of all and singular the Goods, Chat-  
tels and Credits of the said deceas'd, and render a just Account  
thereof when she shall be thereunto required, and need re-  
quire, enter into other new Bond Obligatory; with more  
sufficient Sureties, for Performance of the same; and also to  
save, defend, and harmless keep, the above-named, the  
said Right Reverend Father, his said Official, and all other  
his Officers, Ministers, and Successors, by reason of the Pre-  
misses, then this Obligation to be void, or else to remain in  
full force and Virtue.

I Germaine Lixon of Rothfield in the County of Durham -  
 Gentleman, I made this my last Will and Testament  
 in manner following that is to say I have made all my  
 Copyholme Hous, Garth, Garden & lands & hereditaments  
 and tenements situated lying and being within the manor  
 of Bamburgh in Bishop Auckland in the said County of Durham  
 surrendered to the use of my last Will and Testament.  
 I therefore give & devise and bequeath all such my  
 said Copyholme Estate and premises with their appurtenances  
 unto my good friend John Ryclestone his heirs --  
 & squires and assigns to hold the same Copyholme --  
 promised unto him, his heirs squires and assigns  
 to bear and upon the several rents & Gains and charges  
 following that is to say In Trust to Margaret and either  
 Margaret alone to have & receive and take the same to  
 goods and profits thereof as the same shall become  
 due, And I do hereby devise her the said Margaret  
 alone to pay and apply such profits for and towards  
 her maintenance & entertainment and bringing up her  
 two daughters Mary and Elizabeth -- for unto  
 the youngest of her said daughters shall Attain the  
 age of twenty One years, And whenver so soon as  
 the youngest of such daughters shall Attain such  
 age then I give devise and bequeath unto them the  
 said Mary and Elizabeth --  
 All the aforesaid devise Copyholme & premises,  
 and her and their own Estate for ever to hold the same  
 as Tenants in Common and not as joint Tenants, And  
 in case either of the said daughters of the said  
 Margaret should happen unto her before the  
 Attainment of the said age of twenty One years  
 that then the share of her so dying shall go to the  
 survivor of them, And further in case both of the said  
 daughters before the Attainment of the said age the  
 said Margaret and her devise and bequeath the above  
 and in such case of her and her said Margaret  
 Copyholme premises unto her the said Margaret Relyed  
 her Heirs squires and assigns for ever

¶ Ulso Cwrdorff and Brogudath unto my  
Brother Ralph Dixon Appleson my ffrend, & so  
Brodling leuysos, Byd leuysos Garth, Gwrdon  
and thider Appleson dwntos, Instawth lynnig and  
lawnig in Stannrop in thid said County, To his  
fid bound unto him thid said Ralph Dixon his  
Heires and Assyngs for deo, All thid right  
resydend and reueuynge of my estate of what  
Matured kind or Qualite, soever thd bound. Be it  
¶ Cwrdorff and Brogudath unto my sister  
Elizab-thi Dixon his Heire Excuteris, Admutoris  
and Assyngs for deo, his shirng thid entury  
just 3000 and hundred pounds, And I do  
hirdly make & kee thid said Elizab-thi Dixon  
old Excutrice of thid my last Will and  
Testament. In witness wherof I have  
handed unto, set my hand and seal this Tuesday  
Seventy day of September in thid year of  
our Lord One thousand sevnd. Hundred and  
Seventy eight
